

Call for Applications: Student Fellowship (Chinese Politics)

MacroPolo is the in-house think tank of the Paulson Institute at the University of Chicago. Our aim is to decode China's economic arrival with perceptive analysis and creative research products that provide insights relevant to policymakers, businesses, journalists, and scholars.

We seek to recruit a Student Fellow to join the team that produces our product on elite Chinese politics: The Committee. This product is a unique resource on Chinese politics that allows users to quickly and easily reference profiles of all the full and alternate members of the 19th Central Committee of the Chinese Communist Party.

The analysis of Chinese politics that appears on The Committee focuses on topics we believe matter most for markets, businesses, and the policy community. The aim is to offer relevant information and commentary on political drivers and interest group dynamics that can determine important policy debates and economic decisions in China.

The successful applicant will work with the MacroPolo team to conduct biographical research on China's elite politicians, improve the back-end database that sustains The Committee, and update the product to reflect real-time changes in the Chinese political landscape.

The Student Fellowship program is conducted in partnership with the University of Chicago and is available to applicants who are currently enrolled at either the undergraduate or graduate level. This position will require up to 20 hours of work per week. Fellows receive US\$15/hour.

Qualified applicants should have a demonstrable interest in Chinese politics and be comfortable doing both qualitative and quantitative research. Academic or professional research experience in the field of Chinese politics is highly preferred. Advanced reading proficiency in both Chinese and English is essential, as is advanced proficiency in Chinese-to-English translation.
