

## Call for applications: Multimedia Production Interns

The Paulson Institute is looking for a part-time multimedia intern to support multimedia projects from September to December. The main focus of this position will be supporting the development of a new video series by the think tank [MacroPolo](#). The individual will be involved in all aspects of video and audio production, but particularly video editing using Premiere Pro. This is a great opportunity for someone interested in a future career in creative multimedia production and journalism.

The internship will hone your editing skills and potentially help you acquire skills in production set-up, camera work, and content distribution. Ultimately, you'll gain real-world experience in fast-turnaround video editing and will have clips for your portfolio. This is a paid, part-time internship that requires 20 hours/week in the Paulson Institute's downtown Chicago office.

### Responsibilities

- Video archival footage research
- Create/edit/produce video content and coordinate with the video producer
- Initiate new ideas for video concepts
- Quality control and fact check for all video content
- Help set up interviews and other shoots

### Requirements

- Excellent knowledge of Adobe Premiere Pro
- Knowledge in After Effects and Audition is a plus, but not necessary
- Strong storytelling ability through the use of video
- Knowledge of video production, such as lighting, camera work, and sound
- Journalistic skill is a plus, but not necessary
- Familiarity with Chinese politics/culture is preferred, but not necessary
